### Youth Development Education Coordinator

Deanna Hankes



Deanna is the Youth Development Education Coordinator for the Livingston County Extension Service. She works closely with the twenty-two 4-H Clubs in our county, providing them with resources and programs for their members. Last year approximately 525 Livingston County Youth participated in 4-H, and the Fairbury Prairie Farmers 4-H Club is the largest with 90 members.

Youth development is also going strong in the county. The extension service provides programming at the schools and at four different locations for the Boys and girls Clubs in the areas of safety, conservation, careers, intergenerational relationships and science.

The Livingston County Extension Service is located in Pontiac and they have a staff of seven people. Their funding comes primarily from the Livingston County Board and through the State of Illinois.
