# OSF Technology Enhancements

Modern Technology is great when it works! Point & Shoot programs sometimes work (not today!) Technology has come a long way and OSF has done a lot of research on telecommunications. We are a very large county with clinics 20 to 30 miles away from a hospital. This can cut down on the time required to get to an emergency room.



This new enhancement is called Tele-Medicine and with the use of video teleconferencing equipment., these mobile units can take care of minor emergencies by connecting them to OSF in Pontiac. A good example would be an ear scope - you are able to see a clearer image through this system. They are looking to purchase 2 units, 1 for Fairbury and 1 for Dwight. These communities are strategic to the hospital. The terminology used will be "prompt care". They will set up on Saturdays with a nurse on staff that can connect to a doctor or specialist. It also could be used for follow-up checkups. Presently they are looking at Saturdays and maybe evening hours. This technology has been around for about 10 years. Currently the hospital is using digital radiology which goes direct to computers for a clear picture. The army was the first group to use tele-medicine. Next year it may happen here.
