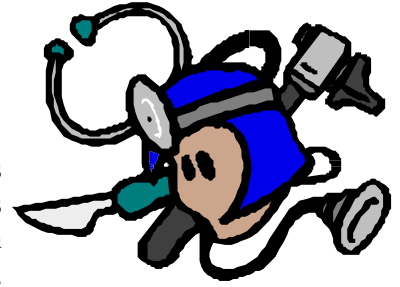

The Praxis

Dr. Kornelia Juergeson

Dr. Juergeson moved into the Medical Arts Building on Chestnut in April and began her practice. In 1966 she came to the U.S. from Germany and settled just north of Pontiac with her husband and her animals. She did her residency at the University of Illinois, Chicago for 3 years. She found the hardest thing was our language. She practiced in Ottawa, Illinois then Gibson City. Since that she has become independent and decided not to leave Central Illinois. There is a significant change in people from north of interstate 80 and south of it. Dawn Huber is one of the office helpers. She moved here in April and loves it, the patients are very nice. Aesthetics and restorative laser are their main practice of giving people relief. Repair of advanced age and sun damage repair make people feel happy. It is instant gratification for many. It is half medical - half aesthetics. They take care of damaged skin - farmers do not use sunblockers. They also do corrections like face lift and variety of other things. They are off on Wed. afternoons. Otherwise, they are always there - no lunch break. Plastic surgery & IPL lasers using different systems and wave lengths for certain procedures are used. The laser has been around for 40 years. They use an icy air

during laser. All devices they use on themselves before they use them on a patient. In hair removal, they actually destroy the follicle in the skin and then the body repairs itself. They can remove tattoos. Dr. Juergeson then discussed insurance from overseas. You have to have it. The employer pays half and the employee pays half. Based on income, it may be very low. You pay for yourself and family. If you are middle income - low income yourself some and family free. The doctor and medications are taken care of. In the U.S. you deal with each insurance. There, the insurance Physician Union Society works with the insurance co. Their Vet medicine was 1/3 the cost of regular pharmacy. Now generics are allowed. They have controlled medicine price for 3-5 years after a new drug is found - no generic can be made. This is to help them to recover research cost, etc. Dental and eye in and out patient - everything is covered. For those in a high tax bracket, it can be 53% of your income, very expensive for them.
