They are very active in our Junior High: Cassie Curry is President, Andrew Vaughan - V. President, Nathan Somers - Secretary, Toby Steidinger - Treasurer, Alex Duffy - Social Director.

Nathan explained that they start in the summer with camp. They sent 11 delegates. They learn things like how to run a meeting, roles and how to be a good council. They have been raising \$450 for the Ronald McDonald House.

Andrew - They participate in workshops and hosted one this year. They learn leadership and teamwork and share ideas, collections and projects.

Alex - They help other schools... like the program "Snow Flurry". I do good, you do good. You make good choices and have fun without "drugs". The IHR organizes this. It is in its fifteenth year.

Toby - This year they had a food drive - Teachers against Students. The students won. They collected 528 items of which they gave 132 items to each of 4 food pantries. They are collecting for the Autism Society Fundraiser. One of every 100 have this with 1 in 70 being boys. A student with this will cost the parent from \$3.5 million to 5 million to take care of them per student.

Cassie - She explained MWAH to us. It is for kids age 10 - 28 to help them with drugs, alcohol and bullying. Cyber bullying is the new hi-tech way.

They have 35 kids meeting one time per month on Wednesday. They do most of their research, etc. during their Homeroom.
