Fabio resides in Sao Paulo, Brazil, a city of 11,000,000. He is a Dentist and fellow Rotarian. He was an exchange student in 1988-89, living with John and Connie Rich. He returned in 1991 for the month of July. He

was a student during P.C.H.S.'s basketball championship run. Since he went back, he found he would have to work and became a Dentist. Both Fabio and his wife are dentists in the Liberade neighborhood, first settled by the Japanese.

In his Rotary club, every other term as President is held by a Japanese. They do many projects and would welcome the opportunity to work on a project with the Fairbury club. Fabio will be his chapter President June 2013-June 2015. Usually Brazillians come to America to visit the big cities and to buy things. He brought his family to show them how different normal life in America is when you visit a small town like Fairbury. He says this is the "real America". When asked what was the biggest change he sees in Fairbury, he replied, "When I was here in 1991 I had my picture taken with the Fairbury sign. It said 3400 people. Today I have my picture taken and the sign says 4,000!"
