Iceland

Janet passed out copies of their map of Iceland so we could "travel along" while watching the slide show. Iceland is filled with geological treasures. It's about the size of Kentucky with a population of 300,000. In the summer, they have 20 hours of daylight - 4 hours of daylight in the winter. Fishing is their biggest industry and biggest export. Many are sheep and dairy farmers but they grow few crops.

This is a volcanic island with eruptions expected anytime. They have the biggest lava flow in history. No insurance is

available for earthquakes and volcanoes but the government has a fund for repairs and rebuilding. Common landscape scenes are of desolate lava fields. The beaches have coarse black sand.

Janet and Dave enjoyed a whale watching cruise. You follow the masses of birds to find the whales.

In this interesting climate, some of the slides showed people swimming and enjoying water slides while observers wore heavy sweaters or coats. The pools are geothermally heated.
